Fund aim

The Fund aims to provide income and capital growth, exceeding that of cash, over a rolling 3-year period by investing in a broad range of bonds and related derivatives of any issuer in any country. The Fund may invest up to 30% of the total net asset value in asset-backed and mortgage-backed securities (bonds backed by income streams from underlying assets such as a loans and mortgages), including up to 10% of which may be sub-investment grade.

The Fund may use derivatives, including total return swaps (derivatives whereby one party pays/receives the total return of an underlying asset or market index, in exchange for payments typically linked to LIBOR), to achieve the Fund's investment objective, to reduce risk or to manage the Fund more efficiently.

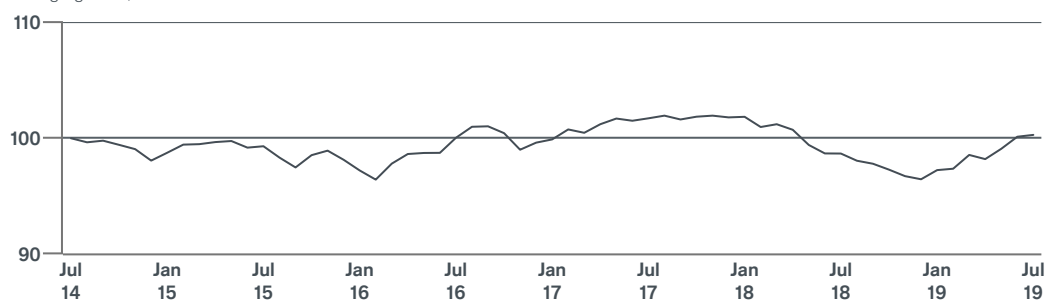

What are the risks specific to this fund?

- This fund is designed to be used only as one component in several in a diversified investment portfolio. Investors should consider carefully the proportion of their portfolio invested into this fund.
- The Fund could lose money if a counterparty with which it trades becomes unwilling or unable to meet its obligations to the Fund.
- When interest rates rise (or fall), the prices of different securities will be affected differently. In particular, bond values generally fall when interest rates rise. This risk is generally greater the longer the maturity of a bond investment.
